Dear Peter,

Further to your fax of today we would like to confirm that the mobile stand has been tested to remain stable in any position on a 10 degree slope.

The worst position is of course when the warmer itself is swung out in a 45° angle with the horizontal arm of the stand swung out by 45° in the same direction but the stand does remain stable on a 10° slope even in this position. (However, in this position all three ends of the stand would bear a high risk of stumbling over which we consider a far greater risk to anyone involved.)

We do of course recommend that the warmer is used in the straight or near straight position because of the design of the stand and to swing out the horizontal arm only in order to position the warmer parallel or across the area to be heated (to achieve this position one usually has to swing the horizontal arm in one direction and the warmer itself in the other).

In any case the stand has been approved to remain stable on a 10 degree slope (but we would like to stress that it is naturally still possible to make it tumble on purpose, e.g. by pushing it).

We hope to have answered your question satisfactorily but remain at your disposal for any further information which you may require.
