GDPR - Right of Access (Subject Access Requests)

1. Introduction

Individuals have the right to access personal data that an organization holds about them. This is known as a Subject Access Request (SAR). Organizations must respond within **one month** of receiving a valid request.

2. What Information Can Be Requested?

Individuals can request:

- A copy of the personal data held about them
- The purposes for processing the data
- Any recipients or third parties the data has been shared with
- How long the data will be retained
- 3. How to Make a SAR Request
- Requests must be made in writing (email or letter)
- Verification of identity may be required
- Requests should be sent to: dataprotectionofficer@viamed.co.uk
- 4. Response Time and Process
- Acknowledgement within **five working days**
- Response provided within **one month**
- Extensions of up to **two additional months** may be applied for complex requests

| - If a request is excessive, a **reasonable fee** may be charged |
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| 5. Exemptions and Refusals |
| Requests may be refused if they are: |
| - Excessive, repetitive, or manifestly unfounded |
| - Infringe on another individual's data rights |
| - Related to ongoing legal proceedings |
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| 6. Escalation and Complaints |
| If a SAR request is denied, individuals can appeal to the ICO. |
