We have recently been informed that babies are occasionally kicking off cot lids. Our obvious concern is the possibility that the cotlid could fall into the basinet and hurt the patient.

## An investigation has revealed:

1. No reported incidents of the cotlids falling into the basinet.


2. No reported incidents of babies causing damage to themselves kicking the cotlid off.

Babies are progressively becoming larger and stronger and possibly more able to dislodge the
collid. It may therefore becoming appropriate to make a judgment as to the possibility of the cotlid
being kicked off and finding another solution for the extra large baby.

4. In the incidents investigated the cotlids have been dislodged or kicked off the basinet onto the floor.

The solutions we offer are twofold.
