Hi Steve,

Thanks for your quote for the Tom Thumbs I've forward it on, to our SCBU department.

I have only been employed at Newcastle upon Tyne Hospital Trust, for the last two & half years, from my relative short knowledge and experience, I have found them to be very reliable, although the old Tom Thumbs no longer meet current specifications, and calibration is more difficult. The old Tom Thumbs are still in active service, but we are embarking on a programme of replacement of pre 2000 Tom Thumbs.

The only issue I have is calibration, it could be just me, but perhaps I don't have enough experience in calibration the new calibration manual is much better than the old manual.

Hi Hendrik,

Please find attached a quotation for the supply of 8 Tom Thumb TT480 resuscitators with the outlets positioned underneath as requested.

Just to clarify, these units will all be supplied with an attached Medirail clamp featuring a wingnut locking bolt; the lever system that you mentioned is an older design that we no longer employ.

As one of the early adopters of Tom Thumb resuscitators, could I ask you a favour? Under our ISO Quality Management Programme we are required to document evidence to determine the useful service life of a product. The units that you are replacing are pre-2000, would you be able to briefly state in your opinion your experience regarding the reliability of these devices?

The units that we have been discussing are being retired from service as per my recommendation so as to standardize on the latest design, as many of the Tom Thumbs that you listed are so old that they would require multiple upgrades which may not be possible with the older body blocks on some of these units. However, can you confirm whether up until this recent upgrade programme, the units were still in active service and performing as expected?

Hi Hendrik,

The C serial number range is almost as old as the B range, I can't confirm exactly when these were supplied but they are pre-2000 so have had a minimum of 17 years in service. Due to a number of improvements to the design since then, I would recommend replacement rather than attempting to upgrade them.

Based on the number of older units that you have, I would be happy to offer you a discount of 5% off orders of 5 of more, or 10% off 10 or more on a 'per-order' basis.

If you want us to dispose of the older units, you can send them back to us and we will put them into our environmentally-friendly waste disposal programme and recycling programme at no charge.

If you want a quotation, just let me know exactly how many units you need to purchase and we can get that to you.
