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Carbon Footprinting

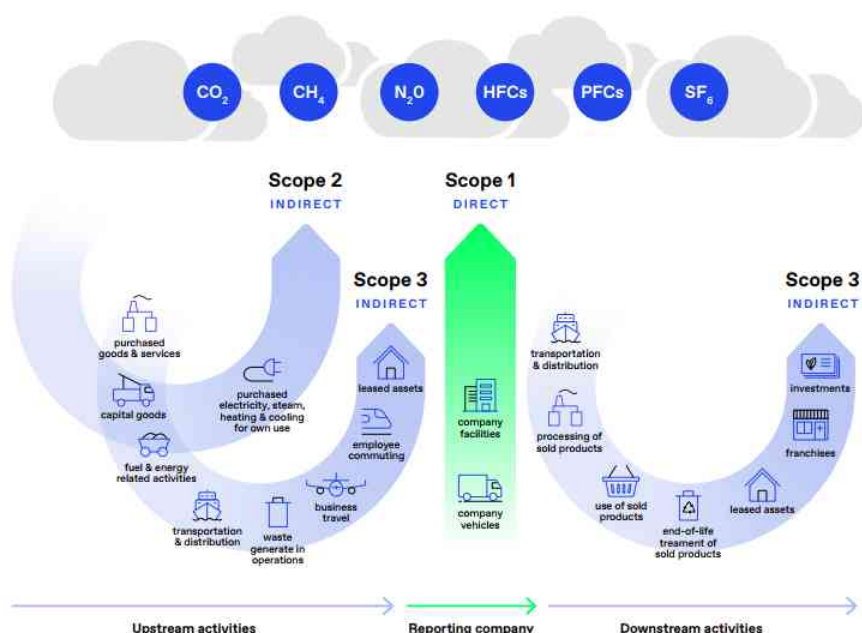
Viamed Ltd measures and manages its greenhouse gas emissions in accordance with the principles of the Greenhouse Gas Protocol Corporate Accounting and Reporting Standard.

The Greenhouse Gas Protocol classifies emissions into three categories:

- Scope 1 – Direct emissions from sources owned or controlled by Viamed Ltd.
- Scope 2 – Indirect emissions from purchased electricity, gas and other energy used by the business.
- Scope 3 – All other indirect emissions occurring throughout the value chain, including purchased goods and services, transportation, waste, employee commuting and end-of-life treatment of products.

Viamed Ltd recognises that Scope 3 emissions represent the largest proportion of its overall carbon footprint and therefore continues to strengthen supplier engagement, responsible procurement and sustainability initiatives throughout its supply chain.

All carbon reduction targets within this plan are reported on a location-based basis and are reviewed annually as part of the company's sustainability and NHS Evergreen reporting processes.



Scope 1 and Scope 2 Emissions Statement

Viamed Ltd recognises the importance of addressing its carbon footprint, particularly in terms of Scope 2 emissions, which are indirect emissions associated with procured energy. While our Scope 1 emissions are very low, we are committed to monitoring and reviewing this regularly to ensure accuracy.

Scope 1 Emissions

Facility Operations

As Viamed Ltd does not own company vehicles or generate its own energy, Scope 1 emissions are either zero or very low.

Use of Bottled Gases for Testing

Viamed Ltd utilises bottled gases for the testing of oxygen sensors and medical equipment, which constitutes a direct emission associated with our operations.

Mitigation Strategy for Scope 1 Emissions

Regular Monitoring

We commit to regularly monitoring and reviewing our Scope 1 emissions status, including emissions from the use of bottled gases for testing. Any changes in our operations that may affect Scope 1 emissions will be promptly identified and addressed.

Optimisation of Gas Usage

We will implement measures to optimise the usage of bottled gases for testing, such as minimising leaks, improving gas storage practices and ensuring efficient utilisation during testing procedures.

Monitoring and Reporting

Progress Tracking

We will establish robust systems for monitoring and tracking Scope 1 emissions, including emissions from the use of bottled gases for testing. Regular assessments will be conducted to track progress and identify opportunities for further emission reduction.

Transparency and Accountability

We are committed to transparently reporting our emissions data, mitigation efforts and progress towards our sustainability goals. Stakeholders will be provided with regular updates through recognised reporting standards and frameworks.

Mitigation Strategies for Scope 2 Emissions

Renewable Electricity Commitment

Viamed Ltd has entered into an agreement to transition to 100% renewable electricity during 2026.

At the time of publication the business remains on its existing electricity supply arrangements pending commencement of the renewable electricity contract.

Once implemented, the transition is expected to significantly reduce Scope 2 emissions and support achievement of the company's Net Zero objectives.

The company will review the environmental credentials of future energy contracts as part of its ongoing sustainability programme.

Energy Efficiency Measures

In addition to transitioning to renewable electricity, we will continue to implement energy efficiency measures to further reduce Scope 2 emissions.

These include:

- Optimising energy use.
- Investing in energy-efficient technologies.
- Promoting energy conservation practices.
- Monitoring annual electricity and gas consumption.
- Reviewing equipment replacement opportunities.

Carbon Offset Initiatives

Viamed Ltd continues to support woodland creation and carbon sequestration projects through annual donations to The Woodland Trust.

This support contributes to the creation and maintenance of sustainable native woodland, providing environmental benefits including biodiversity enhancement and long-term carbon capture.

Monitoring and Reporting

Progress Tracking

Viamed Ltd will establish robust systems for monitoring and tracking both Scope 1 and Scope 2 emissions, as well as our progress towards renewable electricity adoption and carbon reduction initiatives.

Combined Scope 1 and Scope 2 Statement

Our absolute target is 100% reduction or offsetting in Scope 1 and Scope 2 emissions by 2030.

We will continually work towards this target and improve performance wherever practical.

Scope 3 Emissions Statement

Viamed Ltd is dedicated to addressing Scope 3 emissions, which represent indirect emissions associated with activities outside of our direct operational control but are integral to our business processes.

Recognising the significance of these emissions in our overall carbon footprint, we are committed to implementing robust strategies to mitigate their environmental impact and foster sustainable practices throughout our supply chain.

We have broken Scope 3 emissions down into individual categories to better assess and understand them and to target areas for improvement.

Category 1 – Purchased Goods and Services

We procure most of our products externally, with only a limited number of specialist products manufactured in-house.

Additionally, we engage in the procurement of calibration services, IT services, professional services and other operational support functions.

We acknowledge the emissions associated with the sourcing, manufacture and transportation of these goods and services and will continue to engage with suppliers to improve transparency and awareness of environmental impacts.

As supplier sustainability programmes mature, we will seek to gather additional environmental information where available.

Category 2 – Capital Goods

We purchase capital goods when required. These include:

- Test equipment.
- Computers and IT equipment.
- Office furniture.
- Warehouse equipment.
- General operational assets.

We recognise the emissions generated throughout the lifecycle of these assets, from manufacture through to disposal and recycling.

When practical, equipment lifecycles will be extended through maintenance, repair and reuse.

Category 3 – Fuel and Energy Related Activities

We rely entirely on purchased electricity and gas to meet our operational requirements.

Viamed Ltd has committed to transition to 100% renewable electricity during 2026.

The company continues to review energy consumption, efficiency opportunities and responsible energy procurement practices to minimise emissions associated with purchased energy.

Category 4 – Upstream Transportation and Distribution

Our logistical operations rely primarily on trusted partners including UPS and occasional specialist carriers.

We recognise the emissions generated during transportation and distribution activities within our supply chain and actively collaborate with logistics providers to improve efficiency and minimise environmental impact.

Where practical, shipment consolidation and reduced transportation activities are encouraged.

Category 5 – Waste Generated in Operations

We carefully manage waste streams generated throughout our operations.

Waste categories include:

- General office waste.
- Paper and cardboard.
- Soft plastics.
- Electronic equipment.
- Batteries.
- Chemicals.
- Oxygen sensors.

Our commitment to environmental stewardship is demonstrated through our focus on waste reduction, recycling and responsible disposal.

We ensure recyclable materials are segregated and processed through appropriate recycling routes wherever practical.

Waste contractors are periodically reviewed and waste transfer documentation is maintained.

Category 6 – Business Travel

Efforts to minimise business travel include the use of:

- Telephone communication.
- Email.
- Microsoft Teams.
- Zoom.
- Remote support technologies.

Trips are consolidated wherever practical and virtual meetings are used as the preferred option whenever possible.

Category 7 – Employee Commuting

To minimise emissions associated with employee commuting:

- Local recruitment is encouraged.
- Hybrid working arrangements are utilised.
- Flexible working practices are supported.
- Remote meetings are used wherever practical.

These measures reduce unnecessary travel whilst supporting employee wellbeing.

Category 8 – Upstream Leased Assets

We lease essential operational assets including communications systems and other business equipment.

We recognise the emissions associated with the manufacture, operation and eventual disposal of these assets.

Category 9 – Downstream Transportation and Distribution

Our downstream transportation and distribution activities are primarily undertaken by approved logistics providers including UPS, Royal Mail and other specialist carriers where required.

These organisations maintain published sustainability and carbon reduction programmes.

We continue to work with distribution partners to optimise efficiency and reduce transportation-related emissions wherever practical.

Category 10 – Processing of Sold Products

We acknowledge emissions associated with:

- Manufacturing.
- Assembly.
- Packaging.
- Refurbishment.
- Product preparation activities.

Where possible we encourage sustainable manufacturing practices and responsible material usage throughout the product lifecycle.

Category 11 – Use of Sold Products

Our product range includes:

- Medical monitoring equipment.
- Oxygen sensors.
- Medical accessories.
- Specialist testing equipment.
- Associated support products.

We recognise emissions associated with product use and continue to prioritise reliability, longevity and responsible product design.

Longer product life reduces environmental impact and resource consumption.

Category 12 – End-of-Life Treatment of Sold Products

Viamed Ltd promotes responsible product stewardship.

Where practical we accept returned equipment and oxygen sensors for recycling and responsible disposal.

We provide customers with recycling and end-of-life management options wherever practical.

These activities support waste reduction and circular economy objectives.

Emissions Reporting Boundary

Viamed Ltd reports greenhouse gas emissions using the operational control approach in accordance with the Greenhouse Gas Protocol Corporate Accounting and Reporting Standard.

Emissions included within this Carbon Reduction Plan relate to activities under the operational control of the company, including purchased energy, relevant business activities and applicable Scope 3 categories identified through review of company operations, supply chain activities and purchased services.

The reporting boundary aligns with the organisational and operational boundaries used within the company's NHS Evergreen Assessment submissions and annual Carbon Emissions Reports.

Supply Chain Sustainability Programme

Viamed Ltd recognises that a significant proportion of environmental impact occurs within its supply chain.

The company has implemented a supplier sustainability programme which includes:

- Supplier approval and review procedures.
- Supplier Code of Conduct implementation.
- Ethical sourcing assessments.
- Supplier sustainability information gathering.
- Supplier payment performance monitoring.
- Modern Slavery due diligence activities.
- Tier 1 supplier engagement and traceability development.

Where available, environmental information is requested from suppliers to support future Scope 3 reporting and improvement activities.

The company encourages suppliers to adopt environmental management systems, carbon reduction initiatives and responsible sourcing practices.

Sustainability, ethical sourcing and modern slavery considerations are incorporated into supplier review activities and will continue to develop over time.

Waste Reduction and Circular Economy

Viamed Ltd seeks to minimise waste and maximise resource recovery.

Activities include:

- Recycling paper and cardboard.
- Recycling soft plastics.
- Recycling batteries.
- Recycling electronic equipment.
- Responsible disposal of chemicals.
- Oxygen sensor recycling initiatives.
- Product take-back and end-of-life recovery where practical.
- Reuse of incoming packaging materials where suitable.
- Reduction of unnecessary packaging.
- Evaluation of food waste composting opportunities within staff welfare facilities.

These activities support both carbon reduction and wider sustainability objectives.

Business Continuity and Resilience

Environmental sustainability is supported through resilient business operations.

Viamed Ltd maintains documented Business Continuity and Disaster Recovery arrangements to minimise disruption and maintain service continuity.

Key elements include:

- Daily off-site backups.
- Cloud-based operational systems.
- Remote working capability.
- Supplier continuity planning.
- Defined emergency responsibilities.
- Regular review and testing activities.

These measures help minimise operational disruption and support sustainable long-term business performance.
