Hi Ryan,

Sorry for the delay. Please see attached the test report for the 24hr test carried out this weekend on the more economical line provided by Viamed.

We discussed the results briefly before but as you can see in the report, the lines were quite consistent. They weren't identical unfortunately but the difference was quite small between the two lines. I personally don't know the clinical significance of the slight difference but I would assume that a 0.1% reading difference will not affect patient safety. I'm away for the rest of the week but when I return next week, I'll follow up with our clinical team to discuss the findings. It would be good to get their insight as they all have great experience in the ICU as doctors and nurses.

Let me know your thoughts on the test results and report. We will get around to testing the second proposed line but I can't say when we'll have time for another 24hr test. I think it's pretty clear based on the results that the lines remained consistent over 24hrs, there were no obvious changes observed. So I think it would be safe to do some shorter tests (5-8hrs) in the meantime.
