## Risk Analysis Report.

The bed is always part of the Resuscitation cabinet and is mounted on the drop down door.

The main risks are

- 1. The patient dropping off. This should never happen as the patient should never be left unattended
- 2. Cross infection if the bed is damaged or nit cleaned correctly.
- 3. Damage to the bed if it is stowed incorrectly and collides with the equipment mounted inside the cabinet
- 4. The rotating bed adds other risks
  - 1. The bed can rotate and could be left in an intermediate position between locks.
  - 2. It could be damaged by been stored in this intermediate position
  - 3. The bed rotates but design restrictions mean gaps in the outer wall of the remain and the height of the walls is lower that the flat fixed bed.
  - 4. There is a risk of the operator jamming fingers in the rotation mechanism
  - 5. There is an increased risk of cross infection if the bed is not cleaned correctly/
    - 1. There is provision for the removal and complete dismantling of the bed.

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
