Hi Franco

We have been distributing the Maxtec EyeMax range of phototherapy eyemasks since May 2005 and to date 784,446 masks have been put into use.

As far as we are aware we haven't received reports of any incidents, apart from the one at Wythenshaw Hospital.

Their report states three incidents. One of these concerns the Adverse Incident Report (11th October 2019) and they queried the use of another one with us on the 8th December 2017. The other one (occurred sometime over the last two years) was not reported to us.

Referencing our distribution figures, it appears that the design and usage of the EyeMax range is well proven.

Obviously you have other distribution channels in the UK (distributors & OEMs), so we at Viamed are not privy to the sales figures or whether there have been any other problems reported.

Steve Hardaker will endeavour to contact Wythenshaw Hospital for an update later today.
